

"Innovation During Large-Scale Natural Disasters"

ABSTRACT

It is often said that innovation and emergency response to disasters do not mix well. When the Field Innovation Team deployed to the New York City area in the early aftermath of Hurricane Sandy in 2012, they proved not only that it was possible, but their innovative ideas and use of new technologies made significant and immediate impacts to the response and recovery. From Hurricane Sandy to Typhoon Haiyan, Ms. Matel-Anderson and Mr. Birnbaum will discuss how to successfully innovate in the midst of a disaster.
